Reports & Updates

- 1.) The Task Force reviewed section 4.2 which addresses sample size and ribbon spacing. It was noted that while directions are clear for 4in, 6in, and 12in ribbon spacing, the section did not address challenges with other spacing.
 - -The Task Force agreed that an addition should be made to commentary section C4.2 describing challenges with comparing results for the same number of ribbons applied at different spacings.
- 2.) It was mentioned that the definition of "roof section" is unclear making it difficult to determine the number of tests required (section 4.12).
 - -The Task Force agreed that "roof section" or "roof area" should be defined in the definitions section (2.0).
- 3.) Task Force Members acknowledged a growing demand for spatter testing. Spatter-specific test protocols are not currently included in the standard.
 - -Task Force Members agreed that spatter testing should be addressed as part of these revisions (section 4.2 or elsewhere).
- 4.) Task Force Members will continue reviewing ANSI/SPRI IA-1 (2021) and review a red-line version of the document during the next Task Force meeting – July 22, 2025.
