NORTHEAST

I. CONNECTICUT

Connecticut [HB 5245](#) - prohibits the use of plastic straws, polystyrene packaging, helium balloons, & single-use plastic bags

Connecticut [SB 75](#) - requires cosmetics sold and manufactured in CT to meet EU chemical safety standards

Connecticut [HB 5384](#)– Bans single-use polystyrene containers, creates recycling program

Connecticut [HB 5385](#) - Bans single-use plastic straws

Connecticut [HB 5910](#)/[SB 78](#) – Prohibits PFAS in food packaging and firefighting foam

Connecticut [HB 6250](#) – Prohibits single-use plastic products

Connecticut [HB 6255](#) - Polystyrene ban

Connecticut [HB 6258](#) – Straw upon request at sit-down restaurants

Connecticut [HB 6259](#) – Bans single-use plastic straws, exception for disabled individuals

Connecticut [HB 6366](#) – Polystyrene food-packaging ban

Connecticut [HB 6516](#) – Bans flame retardants in children’s products and upholstered furniture

Connecticut [HB 6649](#) – Prohibits use of single-use plastic straws and bags

Connecticut [HB 6945](#) – Labeling requirement for children’s products containing flame retardants

Connecticut [HB 7018](#) – Prohibits exterior insulation and finish systems that consist of polystyrene

Connecticut [SB 47](#) – Prohibits the use or sale of goods or building materials containing asbestos

Connecticut [SB 229](#) – Prohibits polystyrene trays in schools

II. MASSACHUSETTS

Massachusetts [HB 248](#)- relates to disclosure of toxic chemicals in children’s products

Massachusetts [HB 828](#) - reforms Toxic Use Reduction Act

Massachusetts [SB 519](#) - provides for a competitive economy through safer alternatives to toxic chem.

Massachusetts [HD 1142](#) – Provides for leadership by the state to reduce single-use plastics

Massachusetts [HB 810](#)– Relates to extended producer responsibility

Massachusetts [HD 2273](#) – Relates to cosmetic labeling

Massachusetts [HB 1993](#)/[SB 1205](#) – Prohibits polystyrene foam food containers

Massachusetts [HB 3500](#)/[SB 1230](#) – Protects children, families, and firefighters from harmful flame retardants

Massachusetts [SB1400](#) – Relates to the reduction of toxic chemicals in firefighter protective gear

Massachusetts [HD 3750](#) – Bans PFAS in food packaging

Massachusetts [SB 149](#) – *disclosure of toxic chemicals in children’s products*

III. MAINE

Maine [HP 449](#) - prohibits expanded polystyrene food service containers

Maine [HP 88](#) - Improves the manufacturing of plastic bottles and bottle caps

Maine [HP 213](#) - Prohibits the use of certain disposable food service containers

Maine [H 362](#)- Requires the use of reusable food ware at eating establishments

Maine LR 728 - Prohibits use of polystyrene foam food or beverage containers

Maine [SB 296](#) - Regards the substitution of highly toxic and hazardous chemicals in the workplace

Maine [SB 255](#) - Requires the labeling of foods that include nanotechnology

Maine LR 1184 - Protects the environment and public health by reducing toxic chemicals in packaging

III. NEW HAMPSHIRE

New Hampshire [HB 102](#) - allows localities to regulate single-use plastics

New Hampshire [HB 204](#) - Establishes a committee to review the penalties for contaminating drinking water and groundwater

New Hampshire [SB 193](#) - prohibits sale of certain furniture and carpeting with flame retardants

New Hampshire [HB 558](#) – Straw upon request

New Hampshire [SB 257](#) – Prohibits use of firefighting foam containing PFAS

IV. NEW JERSEY

New Jersey [NJ A.1362](#) - prohibits flame retardants in children’s products and upholstered furniture

New Jersey [NJ A.2091/SB 2877](#) - prohibits BPA in infant products

New Jersey [AB 1372/ SB 829](#) - prohibit sale of certain cleaning products containing triclosan.

New Jersey [AB 624 /SB 285](#) - ingredient labeling on household cleaning products

New Jersey [SB 2879](#) - Directs DEP to study PFAS chemicals in food packaging

New Jersey [SB 2878](#) - bans the use of food or beverage packaging or storage containers using BPA

New Jersey [AB 4105/S 2603-](#) prohibits sale of EPS in food service packaging

New Jersey [AB 4394](#) - plastic straws upon request

New Jersey [AB 4543](#) - prohibits sale and distribution of nail products containing phthalates, formaldehyde, or toluene

New Jersey [AB 4715](#) - establishes a plastics pollution task force

New Jersey [SB 2776](#) - single-use plastics prohibition

New Jersey [AB 1372](#) – prohibits sale of cleaning products containing triclosan

V. NEW YORK

New York [AB 90](#) - plastic straw upon request

New York [AB 164](#) - menstrual product ingredient disclosure/labeling

New York [AB 445/S 439](#) - prohibits the manufacture sale or distribution of class B firefighting foams containing PFAS

New York [AB 756](#) - prohibits the sale of children’s products containing phthalates

New York [AB 1057](#) - prohibits use of “to-go” polystyrene food containers

New York [AB 2208](#) – Labeling requirement for cleaning products containing hazardous chemicals

New York [AB 2521](#) - Prohibits sale and commercial use of polystyrene packing materials

New York [AB 2535](#) – Prohibits sale or offering for sale of food packaging containing BPA

New York [AB 3461/SB 2809](#) – Prohibits use of cleaning materials that trigger asthma on MTA

New York [AB 3587](#) – Prohibits sale of children’s products containing flame retardants

New York [AB 3591/SB 3056](#) – Prohibits use of Bisphenol chemicals in children’s products

New York [AB 3877](#) – Requires hair relaxer products to display when they contain dangerous chemicals

New York [AB 4321](#) – Plastic straw ban

New York [AB 4603/SB 3069](#) – Prohibits state contractors and lessees from using polystyrene food products

New York [AB 4459/SB 3014](#) – Bans sale of cosmetics or cleaning products containing 1,4 Dioxane

New York [SB 99](#) - prohibits sale of cosmetics or cleaning products containing 1,4 Dioxane

New York [SB 501](#) - regulation of toxic chemicals in children’s products

New York [SB 503](#) - regulation of Chemicals of High Concern to children

New York [SB 773](#) - authorizes DOH to set MCLs for PFCAs and PFASs for drinking water

New York [SB 1076](#) - prohibits sale of children’s products containing BPA

New York [SB 1096](#) - prohibits use of paper receipts containing BPA

New York [SB 1108](#) - enacts State Healthy and Green Procurement Act

New York [SB 1184](#) - bans certain chemicals from being manufactured, used, or stored within the state including triclosan, 1,4-dioxane, isophorone, cyclohexanone, or any synonym of such products

New York [SB 1367](#) - prohibits use of flame retardants in residential upholstered furniture

New York [SB 2000](#) – Prohibits PFAS in food packaging

New York [SB 2199](#) – Regulation of toxic chemicals in children’s products
New York [SB 2307](#) - Polystyrene ban in restaurants and by food vendors
New York [AB 1547/S 2603](#) – Food service waste reduction act
New York [SB 2823](#) – prohibits polystyrene to-go containers
New York [SB 3166](#) – Prohibits manufacture, distribution, and sale of children’s products containing phthalates
New York [AB 5147/SB 3493](#) – requires seasonal and decorative lighting products made with polyvinyl chloride to include a warning label

VI. VERMONT

Vermont [HB 74](#) – prohibits plastic bags, polystyrene, and single-use plastic straws
Vermont [SB 49](#) – Regulates PFAS substances in drinking and surface waters
Vermont [SB 55](#) – Regulation of toxic substances and hazardous materials

VI. RHODE ISLAND

Rhode Island [HB 5064](#) - cosmetics ingredient disclosure
Rhode Island [HB 5119](#) - Increases the maximum amount PPM of nonpolymeric organohalogen flame retardant chemicals contained in residential upholstered bedding and furniture manufactured or sold in the state
Rhode Island [HB 5314/S 202](#) – Straw upon request
Rhode Island [SB 218](#) – Prohibits PFAS in food packaging

WEST

I. ALASKA

Alaska [HB 17](#) - prohibits sale of children’s products containing flame retardants

II. ARIZONA

Arizona [HB 2395](#) – Repeals state preemption on auxiliary containers
Arizona [HB 2497](#) – Requires that a person selling or using single-use disposable cups, straws, food containers and recyclable food container impose a fee on each item, bans single-use plastic bag
Arizona [SB 1195](#) – Green cleaning/procurement policy for schools
Arizona [SB 1280](#) – Prohibits sale of children’s products containing flame retardants, bans paint or coating removal products containing methylene chloride

III. CALIFORNIA

California [AB 161](#) - prohibits use of paper receipts using BPA
California [AB 886](#) – extends EPR “at store” plastic bag recycling program
California [AB 1080/SB 54](#) – establishes the California Circular Economy and Plastic Pollution Reduction Act

IV. COLORADO

Colorado [SB 34](#) - authorizes localities to regulate single-use plastics
Colorado [HB 1143](#) – straw upon request

V. HAWAII

Hawaii [HB 762/SB 1290](#) – Straw upon request
Hawaii [HB 793](#) – Polystyrene food-service container ban
Hawaii [HB 847/SB 1067](#) – Establishes the “Ocean Friendly Capitol Program” for businesses that do not use single-use plastics, implement certain recycling processes

Hawaii [HB 850/SB 769](#) – Polystyrene food-service container ban
Hawaii [SB 11](#) – Polystyrene ban, requires food vendors to educate customers on proper disposal of single-use containers
Hawaii [SB 131](#) – Plastic straw ban
Hawaii [SB 260](#) – Plastic straw ban that requires individual violators to perform community service
Hawaii [SB 352](#) – Prohibits sale or distribution of bottled water on state-owned lands and by food trucks
Hawaii [SB 367](#) – single-use plastics/polystyrene ban
Hawaii [SB 368](#) – Plastic straw ban
Hawaii [SB 520](#) – Polystyrene food-service container ban, imposes a fee on takeout orders
Hawaii [SB 522](#) - Prohibits the use of plastic bottles, utensils, stirring sticks, polystyrene foam containers, and straws by state agencies by July 1, 2021, and by businesses by July 1, 2022
Hawaii [SB 746](#) – Polystyrene ban in public schools
Hawaii [SB 1527](#) – prohibits sale of beverage containers connected with plastic rings
Hawaii [SB 1543](#) – prohibits use of state funds by state agencies for the purchase of plastic bottles

VI. IDAHO

[Idaho HB 48](#) – Repeals local preemption on auxiliary containers

VII. MONTANA

Montana [HB 165](#) - phase out use of polystyrene
[Montana SB 120](#) – Straw upon request

VIII. OREGON

Oregon [HB 2670](#) - straw upon request
Oregon [SB 96 / HB 2772](#)- establishes a product stewardship program for household hazardous waste
Oregon [HB 2800/ S 90](#) – Straw upon request at sit-down restaurants
Oregon [HB 2883](#) – Prohibits food vendors from using polystyrene containers
Oregon [HB 3055](#) – prohibits sale of mattresses or children’s products containing certain flame retardants unless a warning label is attached
Oregon [HB 3089](#) – prohibits single-use plastic wine corks
Oregon [HB 3355](#) – modifies Toxic-Free Kids Act, removes cap on the number of high priority chemicals

IX. WASHINGTON

Washington [HB 1143](#) - requires notification of discharge of PFAS firefighting foams
Washington [SB 5077](#) - plastic straw upon request
Washington [SB 5135/HB 1194](#) broad chemical regulation including PFAS, flame retardants, and phthalates
Washington [HB 1632](#) – Bans the sale and use of all single-use plastic food service products
Washington [SB 5397/HB 1204](#) – Concerns the responsible management of plastic packaging

MIDWEST

I. INDIANA

Indiana [HB 1134](#) - prohibits the use of flame retardants in upholstered furniture, mattresses, and mattress pads
Indiana [HB 1230](#) - allows localities to regulate single-use plastics, etc.
Indiana [HB 1568](#) – Single-use plastics ban

II. ILLINOIS

Illinois [HB 2076](#) – Prohibits manufacture, sale, or use of any paper containing BPA

Illinois [HB 3379](#) – Straw upon request

Illinois [SB 1854](#) - prohibits any Illinois facility from having fugitive emissions of ethylene oxide above zero

Illinois [SB 1853](#)– seeks closure of facilities not in compliance with current study on EO or state/federal standards.

Illinois [SJR 27](#) - urges the U.S. EPA to conduct ambient air monitoring around EO facilities in Lake County

Illinois [HB 3409](#) - requires the Office of the State Fire Marshal to adopt new rules for the storage, handling, and use of ethylene oxide for sterilization and fumigation.

Illinois [SB 1852](#) - requires notification of property owners within 2,500 feet of leak site.

III. IOWA

Iowa [SCR 4](#) – Creates interim study committee to identify ways to limit single-use plastics

Iowa [SF 24](#) – Bans the sale of cleaning products containing triclosan

IV. KANSAS

Kansas [HB 2222](#) – Plastic straw ban

IV. MINNESOTA

Minnesota [HB 359](#) – Expands flame retardant ban, bans firefighting foam with PFAS

Minnesota [SB 321](#) – Expands existing flame retardant ban to upholstered furniture, etc.

Minnesota [SB 756](#) – Straw upon request

V. NORTH DAKOTA

North Dakota [HB 1200](#) - prohibits localities from regulating single-use plastics

SOUTH

I. FLORIDA

Florida [SB 88](#) - allows localities to regulate single-use plastics

Florida [HB 603/SB 588](#) – Straw upon request

Florida [SB 502](#) – Prohibits plastic straws and carryout bags

Florida [HB 1299](#) – prohibits localities from regulating single-use plastic straws

Florida [SB 998](#) – requires public notification of discharge in land or water of PFAS chemicals

II. GEORGIA

Georgia [HB 458](#) – prohibits use of Class B firefighting foam containing PFAS chemicals outside of emergency situations

II. KENTUCKY

Kentucky [SB 104](#) - prohibits use of Class B firefighting foam containing PFAS chemicals outside of emergency situations

II. MISSOURI

Missouri [HB 271](#) - prohibits localities from regulating single-use plastics

III. OKLAHOMA

Oklahoma [SB 1001](#) – Preemption on localities regulating auxiliary containers

IV. SOUTH CAROLINA

South Carolina [SB 394](#) – Prohibits localities from regulating auxiliary containers

V. TENNESSEE

Tennessee [SB 67](#) – Prohibits sale of children’s products and upholstered furniture containing flame retardants

VI. TEXAS

Texas [HB 856](#) – Repeals state preemption banning localities from regulating containers

Texas [HB 2746](#) – cosmetics ingredient disclosure

MID-ATLANTIC

I. MARYLAND

Maryland [SB 82](#) / [HB 299](#) - prohibits sale of paint or coating removal products containing dichloromethane

Maryland [SB 83](#) / [HB 300](#)- prohibits sale of aerosol products containing trichloroethylene

Maryland [HB 109](#) / [SB 285](#)- statewide prohibition on EPS food containers

Maryland [HB 134](#) – Straw upon request at sit-down restaurants

Maryland [HB 496](#) – Environmental hazards in schools

Maryland [HB 1264/SB 902](#) – prohibits flame retardants in juvenile products, mattresses, upholstered and reupholstered furniture

II. PENNSYLVANIA

Pennsylvania [HB 627](#) – prohibits sale of EPS food containers

II. VIRGINIA

Virginia [HB 2095](#) – allows localities to regulate single use plastics

Virginia [HB 2394](#) – bans use of flame retardants in children’s products and upholstered furniture, establishes the “Virginia Product Safety” fund

Virginia [HB 2596](#) – BPA ingredient disclosure for menstrual products

Virginia [HB 2762](#) – prohibits use of Class B firefighting foam containing PFAS chemicals outside of emergency situations

III. WEST VIRGINIA

West Virginia [HB 2341](#) - prohibits manufacture, sale, and distribution of children's products and upholstered furniture containing certain flame retardant chemicals. Creates a labeling program.

West Virginia [SB 65](#) – Preempts localities from regulating sale or marketing of consumer merchandise

West Virginia [SB 163](#) – Requires state DEP to develop updated human health criteria standards for state waters
